## Annual TCS Meetings in Vancouver

Bob Elner, TCS Program Officer, provides the following news about the upcoming TCS meeting:

This year's TCS meetings will be held with ASZ at the Hyatt Regency and Four Seasons Hotels, Vancouver, British Columbia, December 27-30, 1992. The Crustacean Society symposium on terrestrial isopods, organized M.A. Alikhan, T. Carefoot, and M. Warburg will take place on Dec. 27; proceedings will be published in "Crustacean Issues." addition, there will be contributed paper and poster sessions on a diverse array of crustacean topics. The Crustacean Society Board Meeting and Business Meeting will take place on Dec. 27 and Dec. 29, respectively. There are a variety of excursions planned both during and after the meeting. ### International Association of Astacology News

The Ninth Symposium of Astacology was held 5-10 April 1992 in Reading, England. This represented the 20th Anniversary for the IAA. Over 110 crayfish biologists and culturists were present for 65 paper or poster presentations on crayfish biology and culture. Culture potential of dwarf Mexican species and giant Australian species was discussed. Important commercial species the USA, red swamp, white river, and signal crayfishes, in Europe, noble, narrow-clawed, and white-clawed crayfishes, and in Australia, yabbie, red claw and marron crayfishes were widely discussed.

IAA honored two outstanding astacologists with Honorary Life Membership (Prof. Jakov Cukerzis, Ecology Institute, Vilnius, Lithuania; Dr. Walter Momot, Lakehead University, Ontario). New IAA Officers for 1992-94 include Jay Huner, President; Jostein Skurdal, President-Elect; Paula Henttonen, Secretary-Treasurer. Immediate Past-President David Holdich was organizer and host for the Reading meeting. Abstracts for the reports presented at the Reading symposium are being printed by IAA for distribution to members. Papers will be published in "Freshwater Crayfish, A Journal of Astacology" in the coming year. The IAA meets every 2-3 years with the next international symposium scheduled for 10-15 April 1994 in Adelaide, Australia.

Bob Elner writes: "With the successful conclusion of The Crustacean Society Summer Meeting in Charleston, we have no proposals for future Summer Meetings. Similarly, there are no submissions for symposia at the Annual TCS meeting with ASZ in 1994 and beyond. Meanwhile, there are reports that the Europeans are planning a Second European Conference in 2-4 years [editor's note: the First European Crustacean Conference is being held in Paris Aug. 31-Sept. 5, 1992, as announced in previous issues of the Ecdysiast]. # Upcoming Vote on Name Change of a Regional Governorship

President Rick Brusca sends the following announcement: "There will be a vote of the general membership at this winter's business meeting in Vancouver to change the title of the Society's <u>South American Regional Governor</u>. The Board of Governors feels this would more accurately reflect our constituents from Mexico, Central and South America. This will require a change in the Constitution, which in turn requires 60 days advance notice to the membership of a pending vote. This announcemnt serves as advance notice."

#### Two New Journals From Russia

Arthropoda Selecta, a new Russian journal of research in Arthropoda is now being launched. The editors state that the scope of the journal includes the morphology, taxonomy, development, lifehistories, geography, phylogeny, and evolution of Crustacea, Chelicerata, Myriapoda, and other arthropods, both recent and fossil, excluding particular papers on insects and mites. The journal is published mostly in English with extended Russian abstracts. We plan to issue the journal quarterly. Subscription rates for 1992 are \$51.80 (DM 83) plus \$2 (DM 3) postage and handling per copy. Arthropoda Selecta is a chance to build a new bridge between eastern and western zoologists. For the arthopodologist from Russia, other East European countries and Kazakhstan, it creates a way to join efforts at difficult times for scientific activities. correspondence to: Dr. K.G.
